- Explanation of the International Inner Wheel (IIW) theme - i.e. it changes annually and is the IIW President's theme

## SLIDE 2 AND SLIDE 3 - Who are we? \& An International Women's Organisation

- Globally we are one of the largest women's voluntary service organisations
- We were founded in 1924 by Margarette Golding in Manchester, UK
- We are ordinary women making a difference in the community since 1924 through friendship and voluntary service
- Friendship is important and fundraising bonds members while supporting charities (local, national \& international) on an ongoing basis
- We take action to create lasting change
- We are active in 103 countries, 103,650 members, 174 Districts, 3860 Clubs (Please check on IIW website for updates)

## SLIDE 4 - Clubs, Districts, Association

- Association is the organisation - the national organisation
- Explain where your Club fits in - more about the Club later
- Our Club belongs to one of 29 Districts, covering all of England, Scotland, Wales, and both North and South Ireland
- Together we are known as the Association of Inner Wheel Clubs in Great Britain and Ireland (GB\&I)
- Currently there is one employee at the IIW office and one at the Association office - all other positions are held by members on a voluntary basis


## SLIDE 5 - What do we do?

What do we do?


- Meetings are usually held monthly (no attendance requirement)
- We have representation at the United Nations. We currently have 4 nongovernmental organisation (NGO) members/representatives based in New York (1), Geneva (1) and Vienna (2). They assist and follow the business sessions regarding themes such as Human Rights, Rights of Children, Status of Women, the Elderly, The Family and Drugs - more can be found on the IIW website
- Members meet regularly, work together and gather new friendships
- Members spend moments of leisure and organise cultural activities together
- The emphasis is on friendship as well as personal service
- We pay annual subscription fees
- We are not sectarian or party political

## SLIDE 6 - Members Support

- Explain further the bond between members, times of joy e.g. birth of a grandchild, times of sorrow e.g. loss of a partner and strong and lasting friendships are formed
- Members experience a feeling of wellbeing - the fact you can share
- Explain the difference between charities - entirely up to the members in the Club and may offer practical and financial help
- Give examples of current charities at Club, District, Association (National) and International level


## SLIDE 7, SLIDE 8 AND SLIDE 9 - Our Club

- The Club is the basic foundation stone of the Inner Wheel organisation
- All Clubs are part of IIW
- Our Club is part of a District, geographically grouped together with other Clubs to form District $\qquad$ We meet and exchange ideas with them thus forming even wider friendships (This point further explains item 3 - Slide 4 and shows a different aspect)
- We have the opportunity to expand and partake in administration duties at District and national level
- There is an appreciated obligation for members to be prepared to take part in Club affairs
