
My Club is busy preparing for District Rally in Guildhall and yes, I think you guys will have a day to remember.




Inner Wheel 3-Year Social Project - Strong Women Stronger World

In many ways 2021 was a more difficult year for raising money and delivering goods to Charities.

We had intermittent lockdowns and constant restrictions and most clubs were unable or hesitant to meet in person. Then transport was stopped so donated items could no longer be collected and sent to refugee camps.

Despite all these setbacks I am very pleased to report that District 16 contributions to International Charities held fast and did not drop and £7210 and €4556 was raised for various charities. All the charities we worthwhile supported are wonderful charities doing work with people who suffer appalling poverty that we can't begin to imagine or understand, and it is great that we can make a difference no matter how small. Even with restrictions in place, we still managed to collect baby bundles and backpacks, clothing, shoes, mobile phones, spectacles, and pencils. However, please note that due to transport issues Mary's meals no longer accept Backpacks but please continue to send donations as the children need to be fed. This year already we have seen

awful climatic disasters and now this appalling destructive war in Ukraine. Many of you are already donating to help the people fleeing the violence in Ukraine and I would encourage clubs to support **The International Red Cross** which has volunteers in Ukraine and all the neighbouring countries who can organise what is needed on the ground.
