The Book Bus

On Tuesday 8th November, 108 ladies from the District attended the International Lunch at The Hostess Restaurant.

DC Elaine opened the proceedings before handing over to Lynda Wallace ISCC who welcomed Julie Ramsay, Association International Zone Leader for the North Area, together with Margaret Russell also from District 2. Lynda introduced her guest speakers David Gordon and Monica Mulenga from the Book Bus, Zambia, as well as some of her Executive Team.

Julie Ramsay lit the International candle and Joan Green, North Area Committee member said Grace before we joined together for a marvellous lunch.



Following lunch, David and Monica enlightened their audience with the work of the Book Bus charity which started in 2008 and is the Association's International Charity for 2022 - 2024.

The charity began with one single-decker bus and 1500 books. This has grown considerably since then, with Sir Quentin Blake as Patron, illustrating all the buses now in use. The speakers gave a brief background into Zambia's history and culture and

Monica described the difficulties that the girls face such as Period Poverty, early marriages, teenage pregnancies as well as being a carer within their homes and went on to say that if the books were sent home for the students they would probably be used as paper to light the fire because their parents cannot read, so they have little importance within their homes.

The Book Bus visits at least 20 schools, twice a month and leaves books in the school libraries so teachers can support the children to read. Since COVID, the charity has been able to use the media - mainly radio and phone Apps. The charity also provides training for teachers and mentors and liaises with and through other agencies and Government Departments, inspiring children to a better education.



The cost of a bus is around £40,000 which covers the purchase price of the bus, the shipment, recruiting team leaders, a bus driver and spare parts including fuel. On the day, the raffle, with donations raised £621 and our District handed over 2160





As I write, it has become very cold and frosty with a sprinkling of snow still on the ground.






On 15th October members of Warsop and guests had an enjoyable afternoon tea with author K.L. Lovely.


