The Inner Wheel of Ellon!

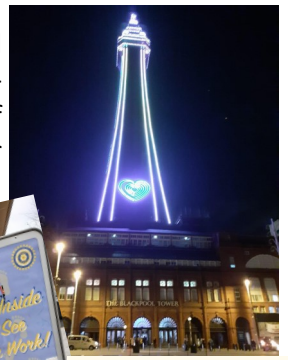

Conference Report : A very warm welcome awaited us at our Annual Conference in Blackpool from the 27th to 29th March. This was a return to a traditional conference with all the usual entertainments, stalls and activities. A party of 30 travelled down to Blackpool from District 1 - including 4 husbands. Most stayed in the District Hotel - the Ruskin - which was only a couple of streets away from the main venues, the Winter Gardens and the Tower - which was lit up in Inner Wheel colours while we were there. Blackpool has been hard hit by recession and lockdown and is currently undergoing a "facelift" with evidence all around of levelling up money being spent to revive its fortunes. Nearly 1200 members attended and we were all so excited and happy to be back together after such a long absence. I didn't see an unhappy face and old friendships were certainly renewed while new ones were



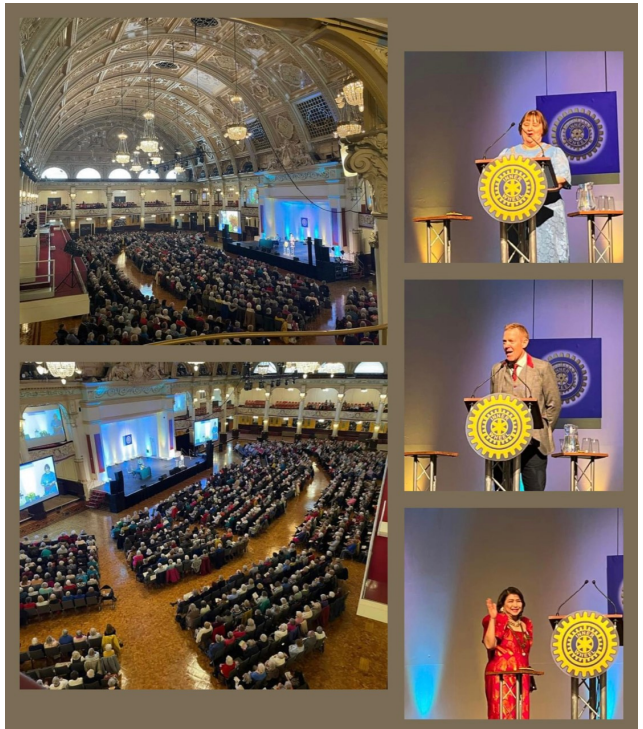
Judy welcomes us into the Conference Hall and the Tower lit up in our honour



made. There was a lovely happy atmosphere throughout and it was just lovely to be back chatting, sharing stories and ideas.

On the Monday evening the District Dinner was held in our hotel - a very happy friendly relaxed affair. *See pics left.* Assoc. President Karen popped in to visit us - I think it was her 7th visit that night! . The business got started on the Tuesday and this did not disappoint, with a knockout venue and fantastic speakers. Seen below are Association President, Karen, International IW President Zeny and keynote speaker Adam Henson of BBC Countryfile fame - he was certainly the star of the show! A collection was taken at the service for **Blood Bikes - £4820** and already Inner Wheel has

raised **£21,800 for Air Ambulances** throughout the UK, with 3 more months of our year to go! One of the most emotional speakers was a **Lynne Baird**, whose son had been tragically killed in a stabbing. She has started a charity to promote a **Public Access Bleed Control Kit** – which had it been around would have saved his life. These cost **£105** and I think many clubs will be sponsoring these to go alongside defibrillators. The AGM happened on the Wednesday and while most of us found the digital voting on phones/tablets easy, there were a few hiccups—including mislaid email links and a time lag. Practice will make perfect. It allowed delegates to vote from home and a video link allowed members to see all that was happening in the hall. This streaming was enjoyed by some of our own members. All proposals were carried with a large majority. In 2022 we raised **£522,013.36 for charities in GB&I** and **£251,431 for International Charities** —with **£71,256** being sent to **Ukraine**. Amazing stuff! Throughout the day pictures from clubs were flashed

up on the big screens. All of our 19 clubs were featured, more than once - so you were all there with us in one form or another. We were particularly proud when Heather, Association Treasurer took to the stage to present the accounts in a clear and easy to follow manner with great dignity and her usual practical style. She was very ably assisted by District Chairman Doris who came forward to second all her proposals and spoke very well. Heather had a very busy conference, running and manning the sales table, which featured many old favourites, now back in stock, as well as a few new items featuring a drawing of the Margarette Golding Rose, to be released at Chelsea Flower Show and Inner Wheel Gin, celebrating 100 Years of Inner Wheel in GB&I. Most of us came home with a bottle. Both of these may be ideas for next year — our centenary!
