Club News

Firstly a small correction to last month's Newsletter – Suzanne tells me that she was only in the South Molton club until 1974 and then after a long gap joined Barnstaple in 2004, so wasn't in IW continuously.

Our Club meeting and AGM were on 6th June, and we also had the Presidential handover, as June, Pat B, Louise and Gay will all be at the Association Annual Assembly at Yarnfield on July 4th which is the date of next month's Club Meeting. On welcoming us, June made special mention of Jane Carpenter who has now attended several meetings as a guest and will be inducted as a member on 4th July. She also presented Pat Malek with a bunch of flowers as it is her 90th birthday on 20th June. June had updated the booklet with the members' profiles first produced during the Covid lockdown and handed a new one to the members who have joined since then, plus an insert with the new details to the rest of us. She had also represented the club at the Mayor making ceremony on May 18th which she found very interesting.



An important topic discussed both during the club meeting

and the AGM was next year's subscription. June, Maureen and Sue have agreed the club element can be reduced from £9 to £7, but because the contribution to both the Association and the District are being raised it will be necessary to increase the subscription. District in particular have suggested a large increase but this



element of the subscription will not be agreed until the District Meeting on 28th June. Everyone felt the suggested increase was excessive, especially as District has a bank balance of £5000, so the matter will be discussed further at the District meeting and in the meantime we are not able to finalise the subscription, but I'm afraid inevitably it will be higher than before despite the reduction of the club element.

During the AGM itself, the adoption of the 2021/22 Club account and the appointment of the Auditor (Paul Petrides) for 2023 were approved, and we heard the reports of the Club Officers. The total amount raised during the year for June's charities was an excellent £2,400.50 and after lunch June presented a cheque of £500 for the North Devon Hospice to Ali Hunt who thanked us, gave a brief talk about the work of the Hospice, and invited us to come and visit. North Devon Hospice has since sent us this (slightly edited) thank you letter that came by email:

We also had collections for the Pakistan Flood Appeal in October 2022, and the Turkey/Syria Earthquake Appeal in March 2023, sent 30 shoeboxes and £50 to cr2ee for Moldova, and donated items monthly to the Freedom Centre. A huge thank you to all for your generosity, both in terms of time in organising events and money. At the end of the meeting we had the Presidential handover when June handed over the chain of office and the President's badge to Sue, and as candles are not permitted at the hotel, we had a blue light lit to indicate the end of June's year and a yellow light for the start of Sue's year.

At this meeting Gay will hand over the District Chairmanship to our own Louise French, still making it making it a somewhat Barnstaple dominated affair especially with Pat B as Treasurer and June T as website manager!
