TORQUAY - CELEBRATING A HUNDRED YEARS OF INNER WHEEL 2023/24

We are the Inner Wheel Club of Torquay, one of six clubs in Devon, District 17 and our club is 90 years old this year. We meet at the Livermead House Hotel on the second Monday of the month at 2pm and welcome visitors and prospective new members. <u>After the club</u>

business we have tea and biscuits and then often a speaker. We sometimes have a social lunch between meetings at a local carvery.

We send clothes and Christmas shoeboxes to Moldova and the Ukraine to support the Christian Response to Eastern Europe known as CR2EE. We have a close friendship with an Inner Wheel Club in Australia and share newsletters with them. We have been collecting items of food to donate to a local food bank, aiming at 100 items as part of the '100 for 100' appeal, the Inner Wheel Association's initiative this year.

In August we always have a lunch to welcome the incoming Club President. This year President Joan kindly offered to continue for a second year and we celebrated at the Dainton Golf Club, Newton Abbot. The Past Presidents in our Club meet for a convivial lunch in September,

which Joan organised at the Belgrave Sands Hotel this year.

In September we had a speaker whose mother was Danish. He told us about the history of the Tivoli Gardens, Copenhagen, illustrated by slides taken over the years since he first visited as a boy after WW2. We were delighted to enrol Jane into the club.

In October a local Morris Dancer and Musician demonstrated their dance steps and played several traditional instruments, explaining the history of Morris Dancing in various areas of the country. There are many groups around Devon, both male and female.

We sent 18 Christmas shoeboxes to the CR2EE appeal thanks to the generosity of our members. The Torbay Yarn Bombers, who are a group of knitters made us a splendid '100 Years of Inner Wheel' box topper from a member's design. They displayed it in the entrance of Paignton's Morrisons store for several weeks after Christmas. Torbay already has a history of box toppers and this was an amazing collaboration.

The New Year 2024! We use the January club meeting to celebrate inner Wheel Day and were visited by our District Chairman Louise who helped us trim and sort a huge pile of stamps. These are sent through the WI to support Lepra (Leprosy relief) and another beautiful crocheted blanket was being made by Lorna to be donated to charity.

In February we had a busy meeting with a review of the very successful 90th birthday lunch and plans discussed for a Spring Fair in the Livermead House Hotel. There was also a social lunch at the Hare and Hounds.

In March we had an inspirational presentation about the Scottish-based Charity Mary's Meals which now feeds an amazing 2.5 million children all over the world every day. We also had a successful coffee morning at the end of the month. April was another very busy meeting chaired by Member of Council Jeannette as President Joan was very ill. By now we had collected 78 items for the food bank. A new treasurer, Roz, was appointed so now we have a full committee for the coming year. Jeannette attended the Inner Wheel Centenary Lunch in London which she thoroughly enjoyed. We were asked to collect good quality clothes for CR2EE to deliver in May to Eastern Europe. Sandra was planning the International Zone Rally for District 17 as it is the Torquay's turn to host it this year. There will be a talk on Java and a Raffle in aid of the Book Bus Charity.

In May there was a minute's silence to remember our dear President Joan Baily and wonderful Past President Heather Davis who was also Past Association Editor and Member of Council. They will both be sadly missed. Joan was a great help to the club as President and was also President of Torquay Rotary for a year. Heather had held most posts in the club, some more than once, as club correspondent, International officer and secretary, having been a member for many years. She was Club President at least twice and had served as Association Editor for three years and Member of Council. She was also a recipient of the Paul Harris Award.

held in 1924 in a Turkish Baths which had stood close to the Convention Centre.

Margarette was the wife of a Rotarian and was a nurse. There is a plaque on the wall of the site, now a commemorative garden close to the Convention Centre and bees everywhere!


Presidents Bideford hosted our Skittles, Darts and Quiz Morning at our Spring meeting. Thank you Bideford.
